

## Condenser Water Piping Renewal, Building 7 (JHU / APL) Laurel, MD



### PROJECT OVERVIEW AND CHALLENGES

Bradshaw installed two 36 inch x 36 inch wood box tunnels, 10 linear feet and 19 linear feet long respectively, as part of a project aimed at upgrading the infrastructure at the Applied Physics Laboratory (APL). The woodbox tunnels were installed directly under two existing active corridors. The hand mined wood box technique was selected over auger boring due to the smaller work area, and the ability to address unexpected obstructions.
